WHEREAS, In addition, each year, over 20,000 New Yorkers earn their high school equivalency and study English as a second language with BOCES services and programs; and

WHEREAS, Steeped in a proud and distinguished history, OHM BOCES may look back with pride upon its humble beginnings, find just satisfaction in its purposeful growth, and hold true of purpose in its commitment to serving the educational needs of the citizens of the State of New York; now, therefore, be it
