The new *The Port Light* serves as the voice of the school community, but in addition to topics of immediate interest to Port Chester High School, the all-student staff covers national politics, world news, professional sports, and arts and entertainment. Faculty advisors Justin Thomas and Aaron Glazer give full credit to this group of highly motivated and engaged students for bringing *The Port Light* back to life after such a long hiatus. Their achievement demonstrates that young people are attuned to the world around them, and share a love of reading, writing and communicating. This feat is also a testament to what students are capable of doing when there is a school and faculty that encourage students to think beyond what is in front of them.

Students met with State legislators including State Senator Shelley B. Mayer, Assemblyman Steve Otis, and State Senator Brian Kavanagh, who sponsors bill S. 647. This legislation would extend and protect freedom of speech and the press in school-sponsored newspapers.

At a time when we are losing so many local news sources, these students prove there is both a need and future for strong, independent journalism.
