## Firefighter Peyton L.S. Morse Memorial Highway Legislation Passes Senate

Senator Mark Walczyk is proud to announce that his bill, S4707A has passed the Senate. This bill will designate the entirety of State Route 180 in the hamlet of La Fargeville as the “Firefighter Peyton L.S. Morse Memorial Highway.

Mr. Morse was a model citizen and a beloved member of his community. A man so devoted to the fire service, he worked his way up to be the Assistant Chief of the La Fargeville volunteer fire department. He began his dream job in 2021 as a firefighter for the City of Watertown.

Tragically, under the supervision of instructors from the New York State Academy of Fire Science in Montour Falls, Mr. Morse began not breathing during a training exercise. He passed away at a nearby hospital days later. Even in death, Mr. Morse continued to serve as his organ donations went on to save the lives of three people.
