## Dear Attorney General Bondi:

We write to formally request an immediate investigation into a blatant coordinated effort by the New York State Democratic leaders to subvert the electoral process for partisan gain. Their latest effort, a proposed change to New York's special election laws, is an egregious abuse of power designed to deny New Yorkers representation in Congress and manipulate the balance of power in Washington.

Albany Democrats, under the direction of Governor Kathy Hochul and House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries, have introduced legislation that would allow them to delay a special election for New York's 21st Congressional District until November, a move that serves no legitimate purpose other than to weaken the Republican majority in the House of Representatives and obstruct President Trump's agenda. This move is particularly alarming given that the state legislature recently enacted a law with unanimous bipartisan support that requires the governor to call a special election within 10 days of a vacancy, with the election occurring 70 to 80 days later. By circumventing this legal requirement for purely partisan reasons, Governor Hochul and her Democratic allies are engaging in what can only be described as textbook election interference.

Since Chapter 320 of the Laws of 2021 was signed, several special elections have been held in the manner prescribed by New York law with two such elections in 2024 alone. In these "Democratic-friendly" districts, a delay was never proposed. A delay in this specific upcoming

special election is a clear attempt to thwart Republican representation both on the state and federal levels. It will do exactly what the 2021 law was trying to prevent.

This is not an isolated incident. It is part of a longstanding pattern of election manipulation by New York Democrats. Consider the following:

- Partisan Redistricting Scandals: New York Democrats have repeatedly attempted to unconstitutionally redraw congressional and legislative district lines to benefit their party, even stacking the New York Court of Appeals with judges sympathetic to their cause.
- Election Law Court Manipulation: Democrats changed state law to restrict legal challenges to election laws to only four Democrat-controlled counties, effectively shielding their unconstitutional policies from judicial review.
- Rigging Election Schedules: Democrats recently passed legislation moving local elections to even-numbered years, a move specifically designed to benefit Democratic turnout and disadvantage Republican candidates.
- These examples make clear that New York Democrats are engaged in a systematic effort to tilt the electoral process in their favor and deny voters a fair say in their representation.

These examples demonstrate a pattern of coordinated behavior that is a blatant attempt to politicize and rig a system to benefit one party over another and disenfranchise New York voters.

For these reasons, we respectfully urge you to open a full investigation into this matter and take all necessary legal action to prevent this power grab by the New York State Democratic legislators from moving forward. 




