The state has a unique opportunity this year, with a windfall of \$5.1 billion from housing settlements, including allocating funding for the new Tappan Zee Bridge. # Senate Democratic Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins Releases 2015-16 State Budget Priorities

(Albany - March 18th) Senate Democratic Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins and her Senate colleagues have released their 2015-16 State Budget priorities. The priorities include: adding another \$2 billion in funding for education; increasing the minimum wage; creating more affordable housing and job opportunities through capital projects; increasing aid to local municipalities to help reduce property taxes; increased funding for EPIC, the prescription drug plan for seniors, and for kinship care. The list of priorities were included in a budget letter to the republican Senate Majority Leader. The Conference has also issued requests for use of the \$5.1 billion in settlement funds available for one-time investments this year, including \$275 million in zero interest loans for the Tappan Zee Bridge replacement project. Senator Stewart-Cousins Calls for a More Inclusive State Budget Negotiation Process at the Westchester Women's Agenda Breakfast



(White Plains - March 13th) While attending the Westchester Women's Agenda breakfast meeting, Senator Stewart-Cousins discussed the budget negotiation process, and how the Governor has opened the door beyond the traditional 'three men in a room' this year, when he invited in a fourth man to join himself, the Senate Majority Leader and the Assembly Speaker. The reality is, she explained, her Democratic Conference represents 8 million New Yorkers yet she, the first female legislative leader in New York State history, has no seat at the table where the state's \$142 billion budget is negotiated. The Senator told the women that if they want the issues they care about to be included in the state budget, they need to speak up. **Civil Rights Pioneer & Centenarian Dr. Olivia Hooker of Greenburgh Honored with Senate Resolution During Black History Month**

(Yonkers - February 24th) During Black History Month, Senator Stewart-Cousins, a former teacher, went back into the classroom at Lincoln High School in Yonkers to speak to students. She discussed the landmark Supreme Court case, Brown vs. Board of Education, that ended racial segregation in schools. She also discussed the federal court ruling that required Yonkers to integrate its housing and schools. And the importance of participating in democracy, including exercising the right to vote. <u>View.</u>.



(Greenburgh - February 21st) Senator Stewart-Cousins recognized the extraordinary life and accomplishments of civil rights pioneer, the 100 year old Dr. Olivia Hooker of Greenburgh. A survivor of the 1921 race riot in Tulsa, Oklahoma, she would decades later fight for reparations for the destruction of what was referred to as Black Wall Street. She is the first African-American female to serve in the United States Coast Guard during World War II. She became a psychologist at a time when few women of color did. The Senator proudly gave her a copy of the Senate resolution in her honor that she introduced. <u>View.</u>.
