

From the Senator



Dear Friend;

With the new year, a new term began for me as the proud representative of the 35th District, which includes Greenburgh and Scarsdale, and part of Yonkers, New Rochelle and White Plains. My three children joined me for my swearing in on January 7th. I continue in my leadership role, with my Democratic colleagues re-electing me as the Senate Democratic Conference Leader. This year that also means that I will serve as the first female Minority Leader in New York State. I thank you for re-electing me as your State Senator and am grateful for

my colleagues' confidence and support.

Our state is facing many challenges, and as legislators, we will be making important choices as we review the Governor's 2015 State Budget Proposal. My first priority is to continue to grow our economy and create jobs. We are seeing encouraging signs -- the statewide unemployment rate is at its lowest level since 2008, at 5.8% in December of 2014. To assist our low wage earners and to move them out of poverty, we must raise the minimum wage to narrow the growing income inequality in our state.

We also recognize that while middle class taxpayers are paying the lowest rate in 60 years, families are still struggling. I support the Governor's proposed circuit breaker, where homeowners will be eligible for an income tax credit if their property tax bill is greater than 6% of their income. This measure would help about a million homeowners and a million renters if it passes the Legislature.

As a former teacher, I understand first-hand the obstacles that many New York educators are facing and the resources they so desperately need in order to help our children. The roll-out of the Common Core was flawed. We were able to reduce testing requirements, recognizing that excessive testing is not the answer to improving students' scores and achievement. I continue to advocate for resources for our schools that are based on the district's needs, so that every child in New York regardless of the zip code in which they live, gets the same opportunities to succeed.

In my opening remarks on the Senate floor, I pledged to make Albany an example of good government. We cannot let distractions such as criminal proceedings involving legislators, nor partisan bickering, to distract us from our important work. I will continue to work hard on your behalf to give New Yorkers the responsible and productive government they deserve.

Update on Tappan Zee Bridge Tolls & Infrastructure Investment

(Yonkers - January 21st) When Governor Cuomo released his 2016 Budget, he included \$1.3 billion dollars of the housing settlement funds to invest in the State Thruway system. The intent is to keep tolls down and allow for critical repair and maintenance as well as support the construction of the new New York Bridge to replace the aging Tappan Zee in Tarrytown.

New Fraud Protection for Immigrants in New York

(Yonkers - February 2nd) Our state has a proud history of welcoming immigrants, and State Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins is proud to announce that the state now has the first-ever, permanent state office of its kind, the New York State Office for New Americans (NYSONA). NYSONA provides immigration assistance at community outreach center, teaches new New Yorkers English, aids in the naturalization process and provides immigrants with free legal advice. On February 2nd, new state laws also took effect to protect immigrants from unscrupulous providers who promise services they do not deliver.

"When immigrants come to New York they need assurance that service providers are there to help them on their path to citizenship and success, not take advantage of them," Senator Stewart-Cousins said. "I commend Governor Cuomo and the Legislature for taking action to ensure that immigrants are welcomed with respect and get the valuable services they deserve as new New Yorkers."
