COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Alcoholism and Substance Use Disorders has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning the systems of harm reduction, prevention, treatment, and recovery for substance use disorders. This includes legislation pertaining directly to the NYS Office of Addiction Services and Supports, NYS Office of Mental Health, and NYS Department of Health.

During the 2024 Legislative Session, 48 bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, 20 were reported from the Committee, 12 were passed by the Senate, and three have been signed and chaptered. This work was conducted through a series of four committee meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

In addition to its regular meetings, the Committee held a roundtable on the current state of addiction and substance use disorder in New York State. Topics covered included transportation and housing, insurance, co-occurring disorders, drug adulterants, and workforce.

COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

The following key bills were acted on by the committee in 2024:

- S3112A (Mannion) *Chapter 599* This bill requires public institutions and buildings to be equipped with opioid antagonists.
- S4103 (Comrie) Reported from Committee This bill directs the Commissioner of Health to establish guidelines for onsite opioid overdose response capacity in community centers.
- S4393 (Martinez) *Chapter 600* This bill provides that when informational cards or sheets about opioid antagonists are distributed, such information shall include information about fentanyl strips and their uses.
- S5163 (Harckham) Passed Senate Only This bill designates services to be provided by a jail-based substance use disorder treatment, peer led recovery support services, and transition services programs as essential medical care services.
- S5373 (Harckham) *Reported from Committee* This bill requires schools to include instruction on the prevention of co-occurring disorders as an integral part of their health education programs.
- S5797B (Fernandez) Reported from Committee This bill provides that the results of urine tests conducted pursuant to a judicial diversion program shall be private and confidential.
- S6499A (Kennedy) Reported from Committee This bill establishes an intensive addiction recovery and mental health integrated services pilot program to support two three-year demonstration programs that provide intensive addiction and mental health integrated services to individuals with significant addiction and mental health issues who have had multiple and frequent treatment episodes.
- S7833A (Fernandez) *Chapter 598* This bill includes xylazine and other substances in the definition of drug adulterant testing supplies for the purposes of the dispensing of such supplies by health care professionals or pharmacists to any person.

PUBLIC HEARINGS, ROUNDTABLES & NOMINATIONS

The Committee held a roundtable on January 22, 2024 on the state of addiction and substance use disorder in New York State. Participants included individuals from sixteen providers across the State in the areas of residential and outpatient treatment, recovery, support services, and harm reduction. The discussion surrounded the topics of transportation and housing, naloxone availability and dosage, overdose prevention centers, insurance reimbursement, co-occurring disorders, drug adulterants, workforce and peers, and treatment access and community outreach.

TWO HOUSE BILLS

In 2024, three of the 48 bills referring to the Standing Committee on Alcoholism and Substance Use Disorders have been signed and chaptered.
