Seeing Beyond Who You Are Today: Finding the Strength to Improvise, Adapt and Overcome Filomena Fanelli



Krista Jones

Krista Jones has lived in the Hudson Valley for over 20 years, brought to the area as a radio reporter on WDST and WKNY in Kingston. She later took a position as News Director/Morning Show Co-Host on WRNQ-FM/Clear Channel Radio of the Hudson Valley and served in this capacity for over 15 years.

After marrying and giving birth to three beautiful red heads, the local mom was looking to do something more. When her friend, a mother of three, was diagnosed with Stage 4 colon cancer, Krista's immediate response was, "let me cook them dinner." Night after night, the Hopewell Junction resident left warm, homemade meals on the struggling family's doorstep and realized she was able to give her friend comfort during her cancer fight. Not long after, 4 other friends were diagnosed with various cancer and while cooking for all of their families, Krista knew this was something she could do for the masses.

In 2013, Sparrow's Nest took flight. In its inaugural year, the charity fed 16 people. Today, the charity feeds over 350 people each week, feeding more than 2,000 people since its inception. The charity originally made meals out of Krista's home but moved the Nest to a new location in 2017 at the Summerlin Plaza in Wappingers Falls, NY. Today, Sparrow's Nest serves 5 counties in the Hudson Valley., as well as families staying at the Ronald McDonald home, located on the grounds of Westchester Medical Center in Valhalla.

Krista serves as the Executive Director and sits on many of the board's committees. Under her passionate

leadership, Sparrow's Nest has received countless awards including the 2019 Falcon Award for Business Excellence in Dutchess County and the Ronald McDonald House 2020 Charity of the Year Award, and has secured significant grants to help expand their reach throughout the community.

Through her work, Krista has touched countless lives throughout the Hudson Valley and exemplifies all that it means to be a NYS Senate 'Woman of Distinction."



Mecca (Santana) Mitchell

Mecca Mitchell, Esq., is the Senior Vice President of Diversity, Inclusion & Community Engagement for the Westchester Medical Center Health Network, a ten hospital system located in the Hudson Valley. She is responsible for building and leveraging relationships with external stakeholders (i.e., community-based organizations, faith-based institutions, academic institutions, government entities, social service providers, and the business community) to explore new and innovative partnerships that create sustainable health and promote community vitality. Ms. Mitchell is also charged with ensuring that all internal organizational policies and procedures across the hospital network are aligned with diversity, inclusion, and equity best practices.

Prior to this position, Ms. Mitchell served as the Chief Diversity Officer for the State of New York. Appointed by Governor Andrew Cuomo in September 2013, she was responsible for the creation and implementation of recruitment and retention initiatives designed to promote workforce diversity and inclusion, while also leading state-wide initiatives to increase Minority & Women Owned Business (MWBE) procurement opportunities.

Prior to joining the Cuomo administration, Ms. Mitchell was the Executive Director of Equal Employment Opportunity & Diversity Management for the New York City Department of Education and began her legal career as an Assistant District Attorney in the New York County (Manhattan) District Attorney's Office.

Ms. Mitchell holds certifications from Cornell University's School of Industrial and Labor Relations in Diversity Management and Equal Employment Opportunity Studies. Ms. Mitchell, who is licensed to practice law in both New York and New Jersey, graduated from Hofstra University's School of Law in June 2000 and is a graduate of the State University of New York (SUNY) at

Albany, where she double majored in Criminal Justice and Political Science.

Mecca Mitchell, Esq. is the Senior Vice President of Diversity, Inclusion & Community Engagement for the Westchester Medical Center Health Network. In her current role, she is responsible for building and fostering relationships with outside community stakeholders and ensures that all internal protocols are aligned with diversity, inclusion, and equity.

Mecca graduated from Hofstra University's School of Law and received her undergraduate degree in Criminal Justice and Political Science from SUNY Albany.
